'The Importance of Perpetrator Programmes'

You are invited on Wednesday 7th September 2011 from 2pm to 5pm at Kents Hill Park, Timbold Drive, Milton Keynes MK7 6TT.

Perpetrator programmes have become an integral part of addressing domestic abuse. In order to help protect current and potential future victims, work to tackle domestic abuse needs to address the violent and abusive behaviour of those who perpetrate it. Such programmes support perpetrators to address the attitudes and beliefs which underpin their abusive behaviour, challenge, stop and prevent further violence and hold perpetrators accountable for their actions. This forum will give an insight into perpetrators of domestic abuse with presentations from Marilyn Francis from New Dawn on the Behaviour of Perpetrators, Lucy Stewart and Lorraine Mansell from Probation explaining the Community Domestic Violence Programme and how Probation are developing one to one work, Neil Blacklock from Respect presenting Domestic Violence Intervention Programmes and concluding with the development of the Freshstart One to One programme since its commencement in Milton Keynes in 2010



This session is aimed at practitioners and will give the audience an opportunity to ask questions and take away with them a clear understanding of why dealing with perpetrators is such a key element in tackling domestic abuse as a whole.
